Time commitment: 3 hours per week.

Contract Timeline: Orientation meetings will be arranged ad-hoc during the summer, formal work starts in September 2017 – June 2018.

Context: Student Voice Initiative is working to increase student voice within education systems across the country. To do this, we need a dedicated team to work on reaching out to and building relationships between different student groups and educational organizations across Canada.

Position Responsibilities:

The Community Partnerships team is focused on working with the Director of Community Partnerships to promote student voice work on the grassroots. Team members may be involved in projects such as:

- Compiling resources to support students in student voice advocacy work
- Leading student voice and student issues conversations in their schools and communities. Collaborating with the Communications team to share these stories through blog posts. Leveraging and developing student voice systems within their communities.
- Supporting provincial and national student voice organizations, and collaborating with education-related organizations across Canada

Position Requirements:

Members of the Community Partnerships Team must:

- Have an interest in student engagement, student voice, and community building
- Be able to work independently with minimal supervision, yet communicate well with a team
- Be able to work towards, and consistently meet, deadlines
- Have access to a computer and the internet
- Proficiency in French is not a requirement, but is an asset
- Advocacy experience.
- Understanding of student voice systems
